





A doctor or someone trained to work with doctors to help people who are hurt or sick.




















## GETTING HELP






## BLEEDING AND BANDAGES



# Open woundA cut or scrape




### **Closed** wound

# HELPING WITH BLEEDING



- Control the bleeding
  - Clean the wound
- Dress and bandage the wound











## CHOKING

If the face is red and the person can cough or speak – encourage them to continue coughing. If the face begins to turn blue and there is no sound, the person is not getting air and needs help quickly.

## HELPING WITH CHOKING




### 5 sharp back blows

## RECOVERY POSITION





- Red in the area

- The bone or joint doesn't look right





# HELPING WITH BROKEN BONES R - rest - immobilize 🙈 C - cold E - elevate

- Stay calm
- Tell the person not to move
- Talk to the person from in front so he doesn't turn his head

### Anaphylaxis (anna-fill-axis)

–life-threatening–breathing emergencyGet an adult immediately

### Auto-injector (EpiPen® or Allerject®) –life saving medicine









This container can explode if it's heated or punctured.



This will burn skin or eyes on contact, or the throat and stomach if swallowed.



This product, or its fumes, will catch fire easily if it is near heat, flames or sparks.



Licking, eating, drinking, or sometimes smelling, this will cause illness or death.

- Never break blisters
- Don't pull off anything that is stuck to the burn
