St. John Medallion

Context

The St. John Medallion is created in order to provide a suitable form of recognition for individuals, groups and organizations where an appointment or promotion in the Order or the award of a Commendation or PVOT would not be appropriate because of the status of the nominee, the honours and awards they may already have received or the nature of their function. This award will be divided in three categories to recognize volunteers, members of the paid staff of St. John and to an individual or organisation that through philanthropy supports the charitable work of the Order.

Insignia

The Medallion shall be 60 mm in diameter, 5 mm thick, and will bear:

- On the obverse: the shield of the arms of the Priory of Canada charged on the badge of the Order on a textured background; and
- On the reverse: a small maple leaf at the top, underneath which is a space to allow for the engraving of the name of the recipient and date of the award with the mottoes of the Order "PRO FIDE" and "PRO UTILITATE HOMINUM" appearing in a semi-circle along the lower part of the medal, separated by a small Maltese cross.

The Medallion will be in an antique bronze finish for all
